Additionally, A2P2 is working with partners to bring two evidence based practices to the state- Help Me Grow and Triple P. ALL ALASKA PEDIATRIC SYMPOSIUM


With over 17 Speakers and X national experts on ACE's, toxic stress and resiliency, we provided over 15 hours of of CME to Alaskan pediatric providers.
